The representatives of our Tampa Office have high praise for the outstanding performance of Assistant United States Attorneys Mark J. Krum and Robert Mosakowski in connection with the prosecutive phase of the investigation known as PARKFAIL. This was, at the time, the largest bank failure in Florida.
